**KEVIN BRADY**

R-The Woodlands

- Heaviest constituent caseload
- Attached his name to the fewest number of bills, as a sponsor or a co-sponsor



**JOHN CULBERSON**

R-Houston

- Was the lead sponsor on the fewest proposals
- Requested the most earmarks individually
- Spent the least time at microphone on House floor



**AL GREEN**

D-Houston

- Best voting participation
- Biggest supporter of President Barack Obama
- Most successful at getting his proposals approved
- Held the most public events in district



**GENE GREEN**

D-Houston

- Attached his name to the highest amount in earmark spending
- Least liberal Democrat in delegation



**SHEILA JACKSON LEE**

D-Houston

- Introduced the most proposals
- Had highest number of sponsored or co-sponsored measures approved
- Most likely to support Democratic leadership's agenda
- Lowest net worth



**MICHAEL McCAUL**

R-Austin

- Highest net worth
- Only member who didn't introduce any earmarks
- Spoke on House floor on fewest number of days



**PETE OLSON**

R-Sugar Land

- Most conservative voting record
- Attended fewest public events in his district



**RON PAUL**

R-Lake Jackson

- Most likely to buck party's agenda
- Least conservative Republican
- Lowest success rate on legislative proposals he sponsored or co-sponsored



**TED POE**

R-Humble

- Made the most appearances on the House floor
- Was lead sponsor on the highest number of successful proposals
- Most likely to support Republican leadership's agenda
